Founded in 2001, the Spellman Museum focuses on 'the history of Forney and the surrounding area from pre-history to post-WWII. Originally on the 2nd floor of the City Hall building, the museum is home to a number of artifacts and photographs that reflect the history of Forney, TX. Topics include Native Americans, wildlife, early settlers, the agricultural industry, the Great Depression, and more. We renovated two downtown historic buildings, 200 and 202 S. Bois d'Arc Street, to house the collection and new exhibits plus provide additional space to host meetings and events.'



Directions - From Dallas, take US-80 east to the Broad Street/FM688 exit. Turn right on S. Bois d'Arc which is the second light. The Spellman Museum is a red brick building on the right side at the corner of S. Bois d'Arc and Main Street (one block past the railroad tracks). Address is 200 S. Bois d'Arc.

Parking - When coming from the north (Broad St), turn right on Front St. to park behind the block of buildings or along W. Main St. You can also turn left on Front St. and park behind City Hall. When coming from the south, parking is available in the Forney Academic Center parking lot and adjacent Sub-Courthouse parking lots at Elm. Parking is also available on E. Main St., but pedestrians are encouraged to cross at either the Front or Trinity/Elm street intersections as Bois d'Arc is an active construction site and impassable at times. The meeting was held on Tuesday, August 7, 2018 at the SOKOL Hall in Dallas, TX.

President Wayne Smith called the meeting to order at 7:40 PM. On a follow-up from his recent visit to Albuquerque, Wayne reported that the Santa Fe steam locomotive 2926 has now been steamed up.





VP Skip Waters has arranged the Chapter sponsored slide show in conjunction with the Fall Plano Train Show. It will once again take place at the Taco Joint, 100 S Central Expy, Richardson, TX 75080. The show will begin at 6:00 PM. Bob Kennedy and Jerry Nunn will kick off the show until Skip's arrival. Those interested in presenting a slide show should contact Skip, who will publish a list of the presenters.

Dave Podransky has taken 10 of the 15 hours of the Chapter's assigned service for the Fall Train Show. Several members volunteered to take the remaining 5 hours. Dave has taken the entire 15 hours for the Winter Train Show in January 2019.

VP Jon Shea reminded everyone that the October Chapter meeting will take place on October 2 at the Spellman Museum in Forney, TX.

The **November meeting will be the Chapter auction**, and will likely take place in Sokol Hall. Since the normal date of the meeting (November 6) is also election day, a decision was made to postpone the meeting until **November 13**.

The **December meeting** is the Chapter's **annual Christmas dinner**, and will take place on December 4 at the Babe's Chicken Dinner House, 6475 Page St., Frisco, TX.

VP Skip Waters continues coordinating the November 2019 NRHS Board of Director's Meeting in November, 2019. It is estimated that 50-80 will attend the meeting, which will take place Thursday through Sunday. The selected hotel, the Magnolia Hotel, although somewhat expensive (\$149 per night), is conveniently located to the SMU DeGoyler Library, the Bush Presidential Library, the DART Mockingbird Station, and Northpark Mall. Transportation to remote events are expected to require only one or two buses. The cost estimates have been passed on to the Board.

The latest block of hotel rooms for NRHS Salt Lake City Convention has been sold out. The NRHS has asked for another block of rooms to be reserved. The evening's program was a photographic essay and former employee interviews about the historic Albuquerque Santa Fe Railroad shops.
