Chapter Business Meeting Minutes, Sept. 2, 2014

NORTH TEXAS CHAPTER, NATIONAL RAILWAY HISTORICAL SOCIETY, MINUTES, DATE: September 2, 2014, Founders Building, Grapevine, Texas.

The membership meeting was held at the Founder's Building in Grapevine, TX. President Wayne Smith called the meeting to order at 7:35pm with 11 members in attendance.

Member Bill Franz brought several boxes of railroad related material for use as auction items. After reviewing the goodies brought by Bill, Wayne decided to hold the materials for the annual November auction meeting so more members could be involved. Wayne passed around the latest copy of Trains which included pictures by our guest speaker tonight, Ken Fitzgerald. Wayne reported on the chapter's book deal with author Dave Bernstein. Sales flyers have been completed and member Skip Waters will take them to the Big Train Show in Houston this weekend to promote pre-production sales. Dave cannot be in Houston due to other commitments but has tentatively agreed to attend the SP Cotton Belt Symposium in Commerce, TX in October for book promotion and photo ops with Joe Strapac.
