North Texas Sets New Rail Ridership Records

North Texas commuters and travelers are turning to the rails in record-breaking numbers, as reported recently in the <u>Dallas Morning News</u> and <u>Trains News Wire</u>. In July, ridership rose to over 70,000 average weekday trips a new first in DART's 25-year history. The Trinity Railway Express ridership increased nearly 20%. In all, an average of 10.8 million-weekday trips was taken on DART in July, eclipsing June's high of 10.4 million. With 11,721 riders in July 2008 compared to 8,362 in July 2007, Amtrak's Oklahoma City-Fort Worth Heartland Flyer ridership was up 17% for the 10 months ending July 31, 2008. **Source**: 9/3/08, **Trains News Wire** at http://www.trains.com/trn/default.aspx?c=a&id=3895

FTA Gives The ROD To The Orange Line

The Federal Transit Administration has issued a Record of Decision (ROD) for the Orange Line. With receipt of the ROD, work will be able to begin on the corridor including the purchase of rail to be used on the Orange Line.

DART awarded a contract for rail for the Blue Line extension to Rowlett earlier this summer. Rail storage locations are identified along both lines and DART expects to begin delivery of the rail November/December.

Review of design-build contract proposals is scheduled for both the Orange and Blue lines in late October. Irving will have representation on the bid evaluation team for the Orange Line and Rowlett will have representation on the Blue Line evaluation team. The cities previously were involved in selecting the teams competing for the two projects. Grapevine Heritage Railroad Envisions 3rd Locomotive

As reported in the Fort Worth Star-Telegram, the Grapevine Vintage Railroad may soon be on the search for an additional locomotive. In August, staff from the Grapevine Convention & Visitors Bureau, a city entity that operates the excursion railroad, rolled out a proposal to buy a third locomotive. The additional locomotive is needed as backup and to keep flexibility in running the line, said George Kakos, assistant executive director of the railroad.

The railroad operates Puffy, an 1896 steam locomotive, and a diesel locomotive. A small 1950s GP-7 diesel frequently fills-in for Puffy when it is undergoing maintenance and repairs. During festivals and at Christmas, the railroad does special eight-mile runs east. A second locomotive is needed for the return trip because of a lack of a turntable at the other end. When the diesel engine breaks down or needs extended maintenance, a leased engine is used to keep things running smoothly, Kakos said. "Over three to five years, those leases amount to us buying one," he said.

Lorne McCasin, the railroad's general manager, said he plans to look for a General Motors F-7 diesel, a streamlined diesel primarily used for freight hauling that was the first replacement for steam locomotives in the 1940s. "Madame Queen" SF No 5000 Reigns In Amarillo

As reported in the Amarillo Globe-News, Santa Fe No. 5000, also known as the "Madam Queen", is regal and resplendent in her restored glory. Restoration occurred over 3 years, with 1,800 volunteer hours and 40 gallons of paint. The engine is 108-feet long, and weighs approximately 900,00 pounds. Relocated from the Burlington Northern Santa Fe Depot to downtown display several years, the move was the subject of an episode of Discovery Channel's "Mega-Movers" series.

Now the one-of-a-kind Madam Queen stands less than a quarter-mile from where today's Santa Fe trains rumble down the tracks through Amarillo. Starting in 1930, the train chugged up and down the Santa Fe railroad lines between New Mexico and Kansas via the Texas Panhandle, Brasher said. Railroads Resume Service After Ike Leaves Town

As reported in <u>Trains News Wire</u>, railroad service in Texas' Gulf Coast is resuming as debris is cleared from tracks and power is restored. However, service to Galveston Island has not yet resumed. Union Pacific has reopened lines west of Houston toward San Antonio; lines running south to Angleton, Bloomington, and Brownsville; line between Hearne and Longview; restored operations at Houston's Englewood Yard. After September 16, routes connecting Houston to Hearne, Palestine, and Shreveport, La., were to reopen. UP tracks to Galveston remain shut down. BNSF Railway's core routes through the region are open; most traffic is able to move. BNSF' route to Galveston Island is

the only BNSF line not yet reopened, but is estimated to return to normal after September 21. Kansas City Southern's main line to Mexico remained closed, but is expected to reopen after September 20. The railroad has reported damage to tracks is minimal, and lines should be reopened soon. Amtrak continues to substitute buses for its Chicago-New Orleans City of New Orleans south of McComb, Miss. The Chicago-San Antonio Texas Eagle returns to its full route today. The Los Angeles-New Orleans Sunset Limited began running as far as San Antonio on September 17, but the railroad doesn't yet know when it will return to its full route. **Source**: 9/1708, **Trains News Wire** at http://www.trains.com/trn/default.aspx?c=a&id=3955

UP Steam At 2008 Democratic National Convention

UP Vintage Steam Provides "Sound Track" For Convention

During the Democratic National Convention in Denver, August 25 – 28, No. 844, also known as Union Pacific's "Living Legend," was on proud public display across the street just south of Denver's Union Station. The locomotive also provided some steam "sound bites" during televised coverage of the convention, undoubtedly surprising the news commentators and viewers.

No. 844 was the last steam locomotive built for Union Pacific Railroad and was delivered in 1944. A high-speed passenger engine, it pulled such widely known passenger trains as the Overland Limited, Los Angeles Limited, Portland Rose and Challenger. When diesel-electric locomotives took over all passenger train duties, No. 844 was placed in freight service in Nebraska between 1957 and 1959. It was saved from being scrapped in 1960 and held for special service. The following change (see text at right) to the Chapter By-Laws was voted upon and approved at the September, 2008 Chapter meeting.

Editor's Mark-Up

Paragraph 1.03 - Second paragraph:

Reads as Follows: The name of the Registered Agent of the corporation at such address as set forth in its Articles of Incorporation is: Steven D. Siegerist

Change to read: The Registered Agent of the corporation at such address as set forth in the Articles of Incorporation is the Secretary of the Corporation. The name of this person will be recorded with the Texas Secretary of State whenever the incumbent in the position changes, in accordance with the following paragraph.

The October 2008 issue of the North Texas Zephyr starts a new distribution tradition for the Chapter. The editor thanks Jim King, Chapter Treasurer, for his suggestion and management of newsletter distribution through the USPS automated mailing process. This will help to get a quality newsletter out to the membership while managing costs and time effectively.

Looking toward 2009, the Chapter has both a challenge and an opportunity to improve the quality, coverage, and features of the newsletter by moving to electronic distribution without abandoning paper distribution. Mail distribution of the newsletter through the USPS is limited to 8 pages (4 sheets) and black-and-white copying only. Electronic distribution would allow use of color photographs, better images, and clearer print in the newsletter. The electronic newsletter could also be viewed in larger font size and greater detail.

Jim King, Treasurer, adds three major benefits to electronic distribution of the newsletter:

- ◆ You can keep the newsletter PDF files "forever" on your computer; they are much easier (and smaller) to archive than printed copies, and they won't degrade over time
- Files are immediately accessible, particularly for referencing upcoming event dates and information no digging through your desk or office to find a newsletter
- You can use the search feature in Windows to search newsletter PDF files for keywords

Your editor sees many advantages to both means of distribution – traditional print mailing and electronic file through e-mail. Newsletter contributors deserve the best quality production of their work in balance with cost-effective use of the Chapter's funds. This change is deserving of consideration by the Chapter members as we look towards the post-LSR 2008 evolution of the Chapter in 2009.

Newsletter Deadline Change, Now 12th/Month


