2011 Elkhart R-B-Q

The inaugural Elkhart RBQ was Saturday July 9th from 9am to 9pm at the National New York Central Museum in Elkhart, Indiana. This was the CRHS' first ever society event in the state of Indiana and sure pleased the Midwest attendees, including your loyal editor Valli and handsome husband Harry.

The NYC museum sits along the south side of the tracks across from the Amtrak station at the east end of NS' busy ex CR Elkhart yard. The line sees upward to 140 trains a day traverse through here, including trains from the shortline Grand Elk Railroad, so the action did definitely not disappoint.

Greenbrier Presidential Express - C&O J3a #614

Chesapeake & Ohio 4-8-4 No. 614 has been repainted and lettered *Greenbrier Presidential Express*.

According to Ross E. Rowland Jr., the locomotive's owner, it will soon be moved west to White Sulphur Springs, Virginia, where it will be displayed on the private car track at the famed Greenbrier resort. The locomotive will act as an advertisement for a deluxe passenger service between Washington, D.C., and the Greenbrier, set to debut July 1, 2012.

Ten sleepers, acquired from Grand Luxe and American Oriental Express, are being converted into luxurious parlor cars at a former steel works in Pottstown, Pa., Rowland added. The cars had already received upgrades to their running gear and other underbody equipment when Rowland's group acquired them. In their new role, the equipment will operate out of Washington, leaving at 10 a.m. Wednesday and arriving in Virginia at 4 p.m. "Everything is on track for a July 2012 startup," Rowland said. "We'll have a 15-car train ready to go by then." Rowland concluded with a comment about No. 614: "CSX has a system-wide no-steam, no antique equipment policy, and we respect that," he said. "The Greenbrier Presidential Express will be diesel-only for the time being. If CSX ever changes their mind, we'll be ready to run 614."

Since 1778, people have come to "take the waters" to restore their health. In the 19th century, visitors drank and bathed in the sulphur water to cure everything from rheumatism to an upset stomach. Because of the water's draw, the resort was known as White Sulphur Springs. Shortly after the [Civil] war's end, it reopened and the resort's prospects were incalculably improved with the completion of the Chesapeake and Ohio Railway. For the next one hundred years, White Sulphur Springs was one of the classic railroad resorts in North America. In 1910, the Chesapeake and Ohio Railway purchased the historic resort property and embarked upon a major expansion. In 1914, for the first time, the resort-now renamed The Greenbrier-was open year round. During the Second World War, the United States government enlisted The Greenbrier for two very different uses – housing for foreign diplomats, then as a hospital and rehabilitation center for soldiers. In four years 24,148 soldiers were admitted and treated, while the resort served the war effort as a surgical and rehabilitation center. The Chesapeake and Ohio Railway reacquired the property from the government in 1946. The company immediately commissioned a comprehensive interior redecoration by the noted designer Dorothy Draper. The origin of The Greenbrier's distinctive décor goes back to this much-publicized redecoration, at a period when Dorothy Draper was at the peak of her fame. As Architectural Digest described her, she was "a true artist of the design world [who] became a celebrity in the modern sense of the word, virtually creating the image of the decorator in the popular mind." She remained the resort's decorator into the 1960s. Upon her retirement, her protégé Carleton Varney purchased the firm and he continues today as The Greenbrier's decorating consultant.
